"GLOBAL COOPERATION IN A FRAGMENTING WORLD"

JOANNA R. SHELTON



Joanna R. Shelton served as Deputy Secretary General of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) in Paris and as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Trade Policy in the George H.W. Bush and Clinton Administrations. She also served as staff of the U.S. House Ways and Means Committee, as an economist at the U.S. Treasury Department, and at the U.S. Trade Representative's Office. She is a member of the Montana World Affairs Council and the Council on Foreign Relations in New York, teaches at the University of Montana, and lectures and writes regularly on economic policy issues.
